Pursuant to due call and notice thereof a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Bloomer was called to order on Wednesday, February 24th, 2020, at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall, 1503 Main Street – Mayor Steinmetz presiding.

All present gave pledge to the flag.

Alderman Reischel made a motion to approve the minutes from the February 12th regular meeting as presented. Alderman Bauch seconded the motion and all present voted aye.

Chief Zwiefelhofer is drafting ordinances that would reflect no vaping on school property along with doubling parking citations if not paid within 10 days.
