Motion by Alderman Meinen to approve Ordinance #01-20 amending Section 7-1-13(e) of the City Code to read as follows: (e) **Farm Animals; Miniature Pigs.** No Person shall own, keep, harbor or board any cattle, horses, ponies, swine, goats, sheep, or fowl, except as provided by Section 7-1-22 regarding miniature pigs or on property zoned agricultural. Motion by Alderman Meinen to approve purchasing a Chevy Tahoe for the Police Department through Southworth Chevrolet in the amount of \$37,533.48. Alderman Bauch seconded the motion. Motion carried with Alderman Reischel voting nay.

Motion by Alderman Reischel to approve a license to serve fermented malt beverages and intoxicating liquors for Jolie Brazeau. Alderman Meinen seconded the motion. Motion carried.
